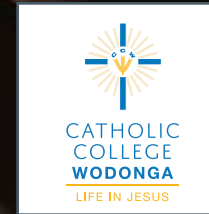

SUPPORT

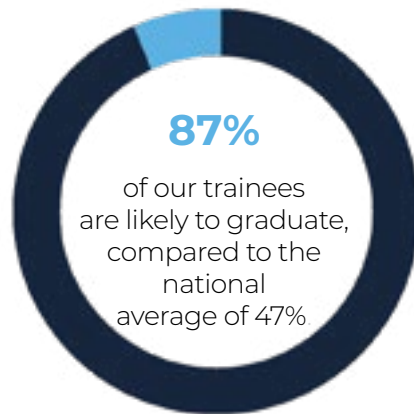
You will receive a dedicated AFL SportsReady Field Officer, who supports the workplace relationship to optimise outcomes for our partners and trainees.
