

AFL SPORTSREADY FIRST NATIONS DESIGN COMPETITION

- 1. Information on how to enter and prizes form part of these Conditions of Entry. Participation in this competition is deemed acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.
- The Design Competition is open to all current and former First Nations trainees of AFL SportsReady Pty Ltd (AFLSR) who are 16 years of age and over on the date the competition commences.
 - All entrants under 18 years of age at the date the competition commences must provide the written permission of a parent or guardian to enter.
- 3. Current employees of AFLSR and their family members are not permitted to enter.
- 4. The competition commences on 4 July 2022 at 9am and closes 1 August 2022 at 5pm (AEDT) (the Competition Period).
- 5. Entries are deemed to be received at the time of receipt of the artwork or image to the Online Competition submission portal.
- AFL SportsReady Pty Ltd is not responsible for any late, lost or misdirected entries.
- 7. Only one(1) entry per person will be accepted.
- 8. The artwork must demonstrate what a traineeship is and highlight the entrant's training experience and what completing a traineeship means to you and your community.
- 9. Artwork for the purpose of the competition includes paintings, drawings and photographs.
- 10. Entrants must submit their artwork as a high resolution PDF, high resolution photo or be scanned in high resolution (300DPI) as a JPG and include the title, materials used and an explanation of how the artwork relates to your traineeship.
- 11. Entries must be entirely your own original work and must not breach any copyright or third party rights. AFLSR will not be held liable for any non-original work submitted by an entrant. The artwork or image must be suitable for public viewing and must not include any defamatory, offensive or unlawful content.
- 12. While the copyright of the artwork remains with the entrant, the entrant grants AFLSR and the Commonwealth of Australia as represented by the Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the Department) a permanent, irrevocable, free, world-wide, non-exclusive, non-transferable licence to use, reproduce, adapt, display, modify and publish the artwork.
- 13. All entrants and their parents or guardians' consent to AFLSR and the Department using the winning artwork or image for publicity and promotion, including the name of the winning entrants, background and the story behind the artwork or image. This may include, but is not limited to, media interviews, social media posts, marketing and promotional materials.
- 14. To enter this competition, you must provide AFLSR with your full name, age, current residential address, mobile number and email address. AFLSR collects this personal information for the purpose of administering the competition. If the information is not provided the Entrant may not participate in the promotion. AFSLR may disclose your personal information to the Department.

- a. AFLSR will use your name, age and residential State when displaying artworks on the AFLSR website for identifying the artwork and Entrant for judging purposes.
- b. AFLSR will use the personal information, of the winning Entrants as disclosed in clause 13.
- AFLSR will not oitherwise publish your personal details or provide them to anyone without your permission.
- d. Details on how AFLSR manages your personal information can be found in our Privacy Policy.
- 15. Entrants must supply full details as required, and comply with all rules to be eligible for the prizes. No responsibility is accepted for ineligible entries or entries made fraudulently.
- 16. Entrants will be deemed to have accepted these rules and to agree to be bound by them when entering this competition.
- 17. This competition is administered by AFLSR.
- All valid entries will be displayed on the AFLSR website and be open for the public (community) to vote for the winning artwork.
 - a. Public voting will commence on 4 August 2022 and close on 18 August 2022.
 - b. The winning artworks will be selected by the number of votes received. First, second and third prize winners will be determined in order with first prize being awarded to the artwork receiving the highest number of public votes.
 - c. Only one vote per person will be accepted.
- 19. The prize winners will be contacted by email and or phone. The Judges decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into. The winner's names will be entered onto the AFLSR website.
- 20. Winning artworks will be announced at the AFLSR National Conference on 23 August 2022.
- 21. The winning entries together with a picture of the artist and their biography will be displayed on the AFLSR website and at AFLSR head office Melbourne for a period of 12 months from the date the winners are announced.
- 22. There will be three (3) cash prizes. First prize will consist of a cash prize of \$3000. Second prize will consist of a cash prize of \$1,500. Third Prize will consist of cash prize of \$500.
- 23. In the event that a winner is unable to be contacted, and all methods of communication are unsuccessful, unclaimed prizes will be dealt with as prescribed by the law of the State or Territory of Australia in which the prize winner resides. The prize remains the property of AFLSR until claimed by the prize winner.
- 24. If this competition is interfered with in any way or is not capable of being conducted as reasonably anticipated due to any reason beyond the reasonable control of AFLSR, then AFLSR reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to the fullest extent permitted by law: (a) To disqualify any Eligible Entrant; or (b) Subject to any written directions from a regulatory authority, to modify, suspend, terminate or cancel the competition as appropriate.
