The VCE, VCE VM, and VDSS allow students to tailor their education to their own interests and career goals. Students can choose diverse pathways that lead to university, vocational training, or direct entry into the workforce, ensuring valuable options for their future.

UNDERSTAND THE VCE

The Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) is the senior secondary qualification in Victoria. It provides a pathway to various opportunities, including higher education, vocational courses, apprenticeships, and employment.

When a student completes the VCE, they receive an ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank), which is a score between 0 and 99.95. This score compares their academic performance to other students in Australia. If a student chooses not to sit for final exams, they can still complete the VCE without an ATAR by opting for an unscored VCE.

This decision can be made any time before the final exams.

THE VCE VM

The VCE Vocational Major (VCE VM) is a 2-year program that combines vocational and applied learning within the VCE framework.

This program offers students more subject choices and opportunities for work experience. Students completing the VCE VM do not receive an ATAR

VDSS COURSES

VET Delivered to Secondary Students (VDSS) courses help students develop practical skills for future careers or studies and can be used as a subject in both the VCE and VCE VM. This means students can choose VET subjects that align with their career goals, contribute to their ATAR via a scored subject, or provide pathways from Certificate III to Bachelor's degrees.

Students can take these subjects in Years 10, 11, or 12, offering a flexible way to achieve their educational and career objectives.

SCHOOL-BASED APPRENTICESHIPS & TRAINEESHIPS (SBATs)

An SBAT is an apprenticeship or traineeship undertaken by a student enrolled in VCE or VCE VM. These students spend at least one day per week on the job or in training during the normal school week. Some SBATs may also need to attend block training sessions occasionally.

The Training Plan for an SBAT is developed by AFL SportsReady's RTO, SportsReady Education (RTO ID 22394), along with the employer, the apprentice or trainee, and the secondary school.

HEAD-START APPRENTICESHIPS & TRAINEESHIPS (HSATs)

Head Start supports SBATs in completing their apprenticeship or traineeship. They collaborate with Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) and secondary schools to assist students throughout their training. A Head Start Apprentice or Trainee is supported by a Head Start coordinator who works closely with AFL SportsReady. The Training Plan for an HSAT is created in partnership with the employer, the apprentice or trainee, and the secondary school.

POST SCHOOL PATHWAYS AFL TRAINEESHIPS

Following successful completion of Year 12, you could embark on an exciting AFL traineeship. You'll have the support of a dedicated Field Officer and an Educator to guide you through every step and assist with your coursework.

This unique opportunity allows individuals to earn money while they learn, acquire real-world experience and invaluable skills along the way.

Currently, our AFL Trainees hold a number of exciting roles, including: diversity and inclusion trainees; events support; gameday operations, marketing and comms trainees; membership and customer support; and, Social Media.

Our traineeships combine full-time or part-time work with study, providing the ideal mix of practical experience and formal qualification (Certificate III-IV). Traineeships can be completed full time (12 months with an organisation), or part-time.



For post-secondary school students who have completed the VCE or VCE VM, AFL SportsReady traineeships offer an immersive and dynamic experience. Traineeships combine hands-on learning with professional development, that equips participants with industry-specific skills and knowledge to contribute effectively to various roles within an organisation.

Our program provides dedicated support to young people, connecting them with a dedicated field officer and educator to guide them every step of the way. For example, working at AFL House, trainees work across areas such as game day operations, community outreach programs, digital content creation, all of which are crucial for engaging fans and promoting the sport. This diverse experience helps trainees to develop a comprehensive understanding of the AFL's operations, from grassroots initiatives to major events such as Gather Round in South Australia, the Brownlow Medal, and the AFL Grand Final.

At AFL clubs, traineeships are integrated into the team culture, with staff offering a supportive and collaborative learning environment.

Trainees work alongside seasoned professionals, gaining insights into the inner workings of the club and building valuable industry connections. The hands-on experience and mentorship provided in such supportive settings are instrumental in shaping the career trajectories of aspiring professionals in the AFL industry.
