What does AFL have to do with school traineeships?

AFL SportsReady is a national not-for-profit company that has launched the careers of thousands of young people. Founded by Kevin Sheedy AO in 1994, the organisation aims to provide young Australians with better futures through on-the-job training and education. Initially partnering with AFL Clubs, AFL SportsReady now collaborates across all industry sectors, including business and administration, education, finance, retail and arts, sport and recreation, horticulture, information technology and the creative industries.

Who employs the trainee?

AFL SportsReady remains your trainee's legal employer, however the trainee will be "hosted" at your place of business and will work for you.

What are the benefits available to my school?

As the legal employer, AFL SportsReady takes care of all administrative matters including payroll, superannuation, WorkCover and the arrangement of the educational components of the traineeship as well as recruitment.

Who selects the trainee to work in my school?

AFL SportsReady will consult directly with you on your school's needs and the qualities you are seeking in a trainee. We will then shortlist applicants based on the identified criteria and present these to you for your consideration and your final decision. We have recruited thousands of trainees for over 28 years and have a track record with over 88% completion rate for this program. You have the final say in who gets the job, however we can help point you in the right direction if needed.

What happens if the trainee is not a great fit for the school?

AFL SportsReady will work with both you and the trainee to resolve any issues or problems as they arise during the traineeship.

Can my trainee be taken away from me?

A trainee will be kept with the same Host Employer for the duration of the traineeship unless otherwise requested by the Host Employer or the trainee.

What kind of education certificate will the trainee undertake?

AFL SportsReady will work with the host employer to determine the most suitable qualification based on the duties the trainee will undertake.

The duration of a traineeship will depend on the qualification, but can include the following:

- Full-Time up to 1 year (38 hrs p/wk)
- Certificate III or Certificate IV level
- Part-Time up to 2 years (15+ hrs p/wk) - Certificate III or Certificate IV
- School-Based 2 years (over years 11 & 12) - Certificate II or III

How is the education organised as part of the traineeship program?

A dedicated AFL SportsReady Educator will host regular training sessions to support the trainee to achieve their qualification.

What is the cost of taking on a trainee?

For a recent school leaver, the cost can be as low as \$22.66 per hour plus GST, which includes salary, superannuation, education fees, WorkCover, and support services.

What are my Work, Health and Safety (WH&S) requirements?

The Host Employer must provide the trainee with a safe workplace, adequate instruction and supervision. All trainees will have an induction in Workplace Health and Safety; the Host Employer is required to be compliant with our WH&S standards.

Under the mentorship of supervisors like Claudia, Emily played a key role in organising and managing year-round events across different year levels, while allowing her to grow her communication and leadership skills.


